Small-Group Bible Study on Acts 2:1-13

Introduction:

8. Reflect on the contrasting responses of amazement and skepticism among the crowd (Acts 2:12-13). Why do you think some people were quick to dismiss the disciples' experience as drunkenness?

Application:

Transition into a time of personal reflection and application with the following prompts:

1. How have you experienced the work of the Holy Spirit in your life? Take a moment to share any personal testimonies or reflections.
2. In what ways can we cultivate a greater sensitivity to the leading of the Holy Spirit in our daily lives?
3. Consider the diversity within our community and how we can better embrace and celebrate it as a reflection of God's kingdom.
